2026 Camp Fees & Information

Registration: The \$75.00 registration fee covers each campers t-shirt, water bottle, camp backpack, and field trip deposits for the camp season beginning Monday, June 1st 2025 and ending Friday July 10th 2025.

Weekly Payments: Full payment of weekly payments (\$235 per camper) is due every Thursday prior to the week attending. Payments must be made online with a credit or debit card. Payments can also be made using Zelle (info@eurekasummercamp.com). For Zelle payments, camper's name must be included in the note field.

NOTE: If you neglect to pay for a week we reserve the right to restrict your camper from attending camp until your account is current.

Special Fees: Additional t-shirts may be ordered for \$10 each.

General Information

Hours of Operation

Hours of operation are from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Camp aftercare will be provided, based upon need, from 4pm - 6pm for an additional fee. Any camper not picked up by 6:00 p.m. will incur a \$2.00 per minute late fee.

Arrivals/Departures

On field trip days, your camper must be on campus at least 30 minutes before the departure time so all preparations can be made to load the vans. Field trip times are posted in the weekly email. If you arrive after the vans have left, you have the option of taking your camper to the field trip location to check them in with their coordinator. Your camper can not stay on campus. Upon field trip return, camper's will not be released from the vans. They must be checked out through carpool.

Carpool

For the safety of your camper, you must remain in your car during drop off and pick up. Any person who is not a parent/guardian picking up must have a **PHOTO ID** and be on the **APPROVED PICK-UP LIST**.

Snacks/Lunches

Parents are responsible for packing their camper's lunch every morning. If a camper arrives without a lunch, parents must either return with lunch or order lunch from a meal delivery service. Campers must bring a reusable/labeled water bottle each day. We will provide a morning and afternoon snack along with a REUSABLE/LABELED water bottle.

Medical Notice

If medication is required for your camper during camp hours, a Medical Authorization Form must be filled out weekly. We will only be able to accept medications that are in their original bottle. If the medication is a prescription drug, it must have the prescription label with the camper's name and prescription number. **ALL medications are kept in the camp office.** All Camper Allergy Forms MUST be turned into the office prior to camper attending. All camper's requiring an epi-pen and/or inhaler must have them on file. *Sunscreen needs to be applied before a camper comes to camp. If you choose to send sunscreen with your camper, you may fill out a sunscreen authorization form for the summer. Please make sure all sunscreen are labeled with your camper's name.

Allergies/Medications

If your camper has an allergy, please fill out an Allergy Action Plan and turn into the Summer Camp Office. ALL campers who need an epi-pen and/or inhaler MUST have one on file prior to staying. Except for emergency aid, no medication will be administered without written parental authorization. All medication must be in the original container complete with the camper's full name, type of medication, date of prescribed medication, with the amount and dosage. Medication Authorization Forms must be completed by the parent before any medication may be given to the camper. Please put the exact times the medication is to be given -as needed- is not acceptable.

Other Illnesses

In order to protect the health of the other campers, please do not bring your camper that is sick with the following symptoms: fever of 100 or higher, vomiting, diarrhea, yellow-greenish runny nose, rash, or pink reddish eyes. Campers with visible signs of illness or fever will not be allowed to stay on campus. If a camper becomes ill while on campus, they will be separated from the other campers while a parent/guardian is notified to come pick them up.

Accidents/Injuries

The staff makes every effort to ensure the safety of your camper. Our staff will complete an Incident Report for any incidents we observe during the day. In the event of any serious accident or injury, Emergency Medical Services (911) will be contacted.

Dress

Campers should wear closed-toe shoes due to off-site field trips and playground time.

On **FIELD TRIP DAYS**- please apply sunscreen on your camper at home before bringing them on campus.

On **WATER DAYS**- please have your camper wear their bathing suit under their camp shirts at arrival. They will need to bring a LABELED towel from home along with a change of clothes and zip-lock bag.
